ENGLISH B

SUBJECT OVERVIEW

English B is a course designed for students with some previous experience of the target language. On the English B course, students will further develop their ability to communicate in the target language through the study of language, themes, and texts. In doing so students will develop a conceptual understanding of how language works, appropriate to the level of the course. English B is designed to provide students with the necessary skills and intercultural understanding to enable successful communication for university progression and in their future careers. Students will learn how to communicate clearly and effectively in a range of contexts and for a variety of purposes and use language to express and respond to a range of ideas with fluency and accuracy. The English B curriculum goes beyond the confines of the classroom, expands awareness of global issues and fosters respect for cultural diversity.

PRIOR LEARNING REQUIRED

All students need to study English on the IB programme. Students will take this course to further develop existing English language skills. English B is designed to provide students with the necessary skills and intercultural understanding to enable successful communication in an English-speaking environment. Grammar and vocabulary building are also an important aspect of the English B course,

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ASSESSMENT

English B will enhance skills in reading, writing, listening, and speaking. Furthermore, it will provide students with the confidence to present, debate, infer and discuss, skills which are highly valued by universities and employers. English B is recognized by universities as an English as a second language qualification and most universities do not require an additional IELTS qualification. Gaining a level 6 (HL) is equivalent to a CEFR B2 level and a level 7 (HL) is equivalent to a CEFR C1 level.

English B is popular with students who wish to study History, English Language, Politics and Business at university and enter careers in Law, Journalism, International Relations, Education and the Design / Communication sector.
