SUBJECT OVERVIEW

Theory of Knowledge is what makes IB diploma different than other courses. By studying ToK, IB DP students deal with the complex problems of the knowledge they acquire in the different academic subject they select and study alongside. By focusing on beliefs, justification, and the epistemology of different areas of knowledge, IB Dp students experience some of questions that are introduced at university undergraduate level and beyond. ToK is more than simply a course in critical thinking, as it is inextricably linked to the knowledge acquired in disciplanary subject areas.
