## GCSE: ENGLISH LANGUAGE

### **SUBJECT OVERVIEW**

English is an essential international language for most businesses and has become the medium of communication in a variety of multicultural contexts globally. It is vital for students becoming adults in a challenging world to be able to be functionally, and analytically able to convey complex ideas and responses in a range of different contexts. Colloquial and formal language would ensure a level of creative and operative independence in any field into which they may be working in the future. It is therefore necessary for each student to learn to read, write and speak English competently.

### **PRIOR LEARNING REQUIRED**

The GCSE Language Course is a first language course and so it is important that each student has achieved the equivalent of Year 9 first language standard to engage in the learning. It is a two-year course, and each student needs to complete the Year 10 course, before entering the GCSE year 11. In year 10, the details of Paper 1 are explored: in Year 11 paper 2 is taught. Paper 1 is revised in the latter part of year 2 as a revision of the skills required and then examined with Paper 2 in the final examination.

**ASSESSMENT**

A variety of assessment styles are regularly set throughout the year.

- Formal summative assessments occur each half term.
- Formative assessments: Individual formative assessments are continuous with submitted class and homework.
- Dynamic assessment is ongoing: an evaluation method used to identify an individual's skills as well as their learning potential.
- Ipsative assessments are ongoing: directly measuring value added progress specifically.

The assessments take various forms:

- Teacher verbal comments and evaluation
- Teacher formal written evaluation
- Peer comments and evaluation





- Self-evaluation.

There is a mock examination in November to assess the degree of learning still required to achieve target grades in the subject. To progress to year 2 of the GCSE course, a student needs to have passed the Year 10 end of year examination.
