A LEVEL ART AND DESIGN

SUBJECT OVERVIEW

A-level Art and Design provides students with a comprehensive exploration of artistic expression and creativity. This course encourages students to develop their artistic skills, critical thinking, and a deep understanding of art history and contemporary practices. Through a variety of mediums, students will create and analyse artworks, fostering their artistic growth. The A-level art curriculum offers a platform for personal expression and prepares students for further studies in the arts or related fields, nurturing their artistic vision and cultural awareness.

Activities and enrichment offered in this subject:

- Visits to local and national art galleries and exhibitions
- Entry to regional and national art competitions
- Curate exhibitions
- Workshops with professional artists / guest lecturers

PRIOR LEARNING REQUIRED

Prior learning is essential as well as an interest in and a desire to study art. Students must spend time studying independently outside of the classroom to be successful in this course. We aim to instil a deep interest in the subject, which can be maintained in courses of further education and beyond.

Personal Investigation: In this component, students are required to develop a personal portfolio of artwork based on a theme or concept of their choice. They explore various materials, techniques, and processes to create a body of work that demonstrates their creativity, artistic skills, and critical thinking.

Externally Set Assignment: AQA provides a selection of exam paper themes from which students choose one. They are given preparatory time to develop ideas and concepts before creating a final response during a specified examination period.

Both components are assessed on artistic skill, creative ideas, research, and critical analysis. The final grade is based on the overall performance in these assessments. Students are encouraged to demonstrate their understanding of art history, contemporary art, and their personal artistic development throughout the course.
